Download and **share** the World Labyrinth Day in Schools [promo brochure](#) with students and teachers.

Consider your local circumstances and decide if you will organise or take part in an event.

Begin planning: think about the what and the how. The [resources options](#) we have prepared can readily be adapted and/or shared digitally with students. We recommend using personal finger labyrinths this year as outdoor or indoor labyrinths could compromise social distancing regulations in your area.

- Have students experienced labyrinths previously or will this be a new experience for them?
- What kinds of materials will you need to provide in either scenario?
- How will you deliver this if the students are not in the same physical space?
- What kinds of digital tools might you need to employ?
- Who could you collaborate with: a planning team or a buddy class perhaps?
